
What's happening in Year 3?

THEME!

Our current Theme is: *Would you like to go on Safari?*



This half term your child is going to be learning all about African animals and their adaptations. We kicked things off with an exciting visit to the Yorkshire Wildlife Park. We were especially lucky this year as the weather for our trip was excellent so all of the animals were enjoying the sunshine.



We will also be using our knowledge we gain to help with our writing, which this half term is all about persuasion. We are going to learn what it means to persuade people. We will be exploring the language features of this text type and using our knowledge to write a persuasive leaflet inviting people to visit a Harehills Safari Park that the children will be designing.
